She proceeded to read "The Language of the Charter (Kaua'i County Charter, section 11.03.C) currently says the police Commission must, "Receive, consider, and investigate charges brought by the public against the conduct of the department or any of its members and submit a written report of its findings to the chief of police within ninety days." Ms. Ching asked if it ended there.  Commissioner TenBruggencate noted it continued and began reading further "This language is unclear because some investigations can take over 90 days to complete and this amendment would clarify that the Commission shall submit a written report of its findings to the Chief of Police within 90 days after the investigation has been completed." He clarified that what Ms. Ching read and what he read was the sum of what was being proposed.
